

Falcons - Term 5

This term we will be learning about coasts and coastal features around the UK. This will form the basis for our learning in a range of different curriculum areas.

Science

We will be learning how to work scientifically by working through the process of planning, carrying out and evaluating an experiment linked to coastal erosion.

Computing

In our computing lessons, we will be developing our knowledge and understanding of databases. We will explore how to use, search and compare databases as well as identify their uses in the modern world.

English

This term we will be reading the books 'Orphans of the Tide' by Struan Murray and 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner. These stories will set the scene for our topic and will be a starting point for a variety of different writing activities. The children will also be exploring the concept of debate through writing balanced arguments. Throughout their writing opportunities, the children will learn to structure their work to good effect using varying sentence structures and linking devices between paragraphs. They will also have a continued focus on choosing appropriate vocabulary and punctuation to communicate their ideas.

Maths

Throughout this term we will be regularly revisiting and consolidating our learning on number and calculation. Alongside this, we will be learning about statistics and developing our understanding of the properties of shape. We will then move on to angles - drawing, measuring and identifying different types of angles. The children will continue to have the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge of these areas in concrete, visual and abstract ways, developing reasoning and problem solving strategies as they learn.

PSHE

This term, the children will be learning about relationships. They will learn how to maintain good relationships and how to overcome difficulties or resolve conflicts when problems occur.

Music

In music lessons this term, the children will be learning about the dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.) through listening to music, singing and playing instruments.

Geography

Within our geography sessions this term, we will be identifying coastal features around the UK, exploring how different landscapes are formed and are changing over time.

R.E

In our RE sessions this term we will be exploring the question, 'What is the kingdom of God?' We will discover what people believe and what difference this makes to how they live.

Art & Design Technology

In our art lessons, the children will be exploring and creating collage seascapes inspired by the work of Matthew Cusick.
