PSHE/Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This term we will be settling into school and exploring our classroom. Our Year I children will be supporting their new Reception friends in learning all about our school

We will be looking at our similarities and differences and talking about how brilliant it is that we're all unique!

We will be thinking about our dreams and aspirations and talking about what we want to achieve this year, We will be talking about our feelings and exploring when we feel a certain way.

English/Literacy

In literacy we will be exploring lots of stories around families and writing about the people we know and

We will also be exploring traditional tales, exploring retelling them in different ways and our Year I children will be writing character descriptions and alternate endings!

Our Reception children will begin working on initial sounds in phonics.

In RE this term we will be learning about how it feels to belong to a community. We will also be exploring the value of Thankfulness.

Communication and Language

This term we will be working on our listening skills. We will be following simple instructions and joining in with songs and rhymes.

Computing-

We will be exploring technology around us and talking about how we use technology. We will also explore taking digital pictures.

Physical Development

This term our Reception children will be exploring PE for the first time. They will focus on dressing and redressing for PE- Please practise this at home! We will be exploring the different movements our bodies can make.

We are working on our skills of sending and receiving balls.

We will also be working on our fine motor skills, using tools such as scissors and paintbrushes effectively and developing our letter formation.

Mathematics

Our Reception children will begin by exploring pairs, and matching.

Then we will be exploring counting and demonstrating numbers to 5 using a range of resources. They will also be matching numeral to quantity and exploring number bonds to 5.

Our Year I children will be revising and deepening their understanding of addition and subtraction to 10. They will be practising their counting to 100 and exploring counting in 2's, 5's and 10's We will also be exploring patterns, spotting patterns,

continuing patterns and making their own patterns.



Attendance Matters

We believe that regular attendance is vital to your child's progress, wellbeing, and overall enjoyment of school life. When children miss school, they miss key parts of their learning, which can make it harder for them to keep up with their peers.

► To encourage excellent attendance, each week the class with the highest attendance is celebrated by being awarded Dunstan, our special attendance bear. Dunstan stays with the winning class for the

week.


