Using our key texts, we will be exploring the genres of instructions and traditional tales. We will write a set of instructions for how to escape using a vegetable as a mode of transport and a fable inspired by the Indian animal stories we will read. As always, the children will have daily phonics lessons and regular reading experiences too.

Maths

The world of multiplication and division will form the basis of our learning in maths this term. One of our key focuses will be counting in and then learning the 2, 5 and 10- times tables. We will also learn about equal groupings, arrays and the law of commutativity.
